- 2. Shaking of the ______: "and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken. And immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bonds were unfastened." (Vs. 26)
 - a. Foundations: "shaken"
 - **b.** Doors: "opened"
 - **c.** Bonds: "unfastened"
- **3. Stopped by a** ______: "But Paul cried with a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." (Vs. 28)
 - **a.** Voice of Concern: "cried with a loud voice"
 - **b.** Voice of Compassion: "Don't harm yourself"
- **4. Seeking of** _____: "Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Vs. 30)
 - **a.** Plan of Salvation: "And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus," (Vs. 31b)
 - **b.** Promise of Salvation: "you will be saved, you and your household." (Vs. 31b)
 - **c. Picture of Salvation:** "And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was baptized at once, he and all his family." (Vs. 33)

Takeaway: When you hit midnight, don't panic. God does His best writing in the dark.
