

I Know That Song!

Small Group Discussion Questions

Exodus 14, 15 • Revelation 15

- 1. Moses told the people to “stand firm” instead of running or fighting.** When have you faced a situation where God was calling you to be still and trust Him rather than take matters into your own hands? What made that difficult?
- 2. The Israelites’ deliverance at the Red Sea became a song they couldn’t stop singing.** What is a moment in your life where God came through for you in a way that still makes you want to praise Him when you think about it?
- 3. Exodus 15:18 declares “The Lord will reign forever and ever,” and Revelation 15:3 echoes that same song in heaven.** What does it mean to you personally that the victories God wins on earth are still being celebrated in eternity?
- 4. Revelation 20:4 describes saints who were beheaded rather than worship the beast or receive his mark, and Revelation 12:11 says they overcame by the blood of the Lamb and the word of their testimony.** In what areas of your life are you being pressured to compromise your faith, and what does it look like to “refuse to bow the knee” in those situations today?
- 5. The Song of Moses in Exodus 15 and the Song of the Lamb in Revelation 15 are essentially the same song sung across thousands of years.** What does it tell us about God that His people in every generation — from ancient Israel to the tribulation saints — are singing the same victory song? How does that give you confidence for what you are facing right now?
- 6. The sermon connects Moses’ song at the Red Sea all the way to the song sung in heaven.** If your life were a song God is writing, what battle are you currently in the middle of — and how does knowing God always gets the final song change the way you’re facing it?

Takeaway Thought

Every battle you are walking through right now is not the end of your story; it is the setup for your song. From the banks of the Red Sea to the shores of eternity, God has never lost a battle, and He is not about to start with yours. Stand firm, watch Him work, and get ready to sing.
