

Title: Kingdom Prayer (Part 2)

Text: Matthew 6:10

Target: Not Just Memorized, but Personalized.

Kingdom of God Definition: The “Kingdom of God” is the **Dominion of God** ruled by the **Government of God** under the **Reign of God**, that is simultaneously spiritual and physical, supernatural and natural, present and future, global and local, all through the **visible life of Jesus** and the **invisible power of the Holy Spirit**.

I. **Declaration of Acceptance & Allegiance:**

- **God as KING :** *Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven* (6:10)
- Your Authority:** *“Your kingdom”*
 - **Dominion of God:** Supreme rule over all creation.
 - **Government of God:** Laws, principles, rules that uphold truth, righteousness, and justice.
 - **Reign of God:** Purpose and plan of God fulfilled.

Question #1: How does the truth that God is the King of all creation challenge your perspective on the events happening in your life and the world around you? How does this shape your daily choices and actions?

- Your Agenda:** *“Your Will”*
 - **General Will:** Glorify God and Grow in Faith.
 - **Salvation:** *And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent* (John 17:3)
 - **Sanctification:** *And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.* (1 Cor. 6:11)
 - **Service:** *For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.* (Ephesians 2:10)
 - **Specific Will:** Detailed plan for your life. (Jeremiah 1:5, Jeremiah 29:11)
 - **Chosen:** *“Before I formed you in the womb I knew you”* (Vs.5a)
 - **Consecrated:** *“and before you were born I consecrated you;”* (Vs.5b)
 - Personality:** Nothing about you is accidental. (Psalm 139:14)
 - Past:** Nothing wasted. (Romans 8:28)
 - Pain:** Your pain has purpose. (Gen. 50:20)
 - Purpose:** Ability, affinity, affirmation (1 Cor. 12:4-6)
 - **Calling:** *“I appointed you a prophet to the nations”* (Vs.5c)

Question #2: How do you differentiate between your personal will and God's will in your life? Reflect on a time where God's will challenged your own desires, and how did you respond to His leading?

Question #3: How can you view past or present painful experiences through the lens of God's purpose for your life? How might God be using your pain to refine your character or prepare you for something greater?

My Acceptance: “Be done”

- **Statement of Submission:** *Seek **first** the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things will be added to you. (Matthew 6:33)*
- **Sentiment of Surrender:** *I appeal to you therefore, by the mercies of God, to **present** your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. (Romans 12:1)*
- **Sensitive to the Spirit:** *Do not **quench** the Spirit (1 Thess. 5:19)*

Question #4: How do you respond to Romans 12:1, where you are called to present your body as a living sacrifice? What specific areas of your life might you need to surrender more fully to God’s will?

Question #5: How can you cultivate a heart that is sensitive to the Holy Spirit’s leading in your life (1 Thess. 5:19)? What steps can you take to ensure you’re not quenching the Spirit?

Your Administration: “On earth as it is in heaven”

- **Heart of Heaven:** *He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away. (Revelation 21:4)*
- **Heart of You:** *Behold, the kingdom of God is in the midst of you. (Luke 17:21)*
- **Heart for others:** *The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel. (Mark 1:15) *Isaiah 61:1*

Question #6: Revelation 21:4 paints a picture of the ultimate restoration where pain, suffering, and death will be no more. How does this future hope impact the way you endure trials and hardships now?

Question #7: Take a moment to reflect on how the truths in this message call you to greater alignment with God’s kingdom agenda. What is one concrete step you can take to live out the prayer “Your kingdom come, Your will be done” in your life?

Takeaway: The Lord’s Prayer was not intended to be poetic, BUT prophetic!
