Accountability: Let's follow up from last week.

- We've talked about walking in obedience this summer...what is one area you need to be more obedient in your life?

Listen: What does God's Word say?

- What stands out to you from this weekend's message and/or this verse?
- The people of Israel had strayed from doing what was right in the beginning of the book. Why is it so easy to stray away from what God tells us to do and live our own way? And how can we fight against drifting from God? *Because of our sin nature. The best way to fight against our sin nature is by remembering God's truth and reading His Word.*
- The end of Micah (7:19) reminds us of God's mercy and forgiveness. How does it make you feel knowing that no matter what we do, God will always forgive us?

Live It Out: What is God saying to me?

- Based on Micah 6:8, what is one thing you need to change about your life this week?
